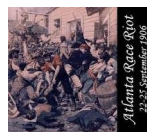
Southern Museum and Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park. Enjoy a vigorous hike up Kennesaw Mountain and follow either the self-guided cell phone tour or your tour guide as you learn about the historic events of the battle fought here in 1864. Your visit ends with a tour through the Southern Museum of Civil War & Locomotive History!



Goat Farm Arts Center is a mid-Victorian industrial site with twelve acres of pastoral grounds, converted to a major visual and performing arts center. The Goat Farm is also home to resident performance companies the gloATL, Saiah Arts International and The Collective Project Inc., and the site contains a café/library, an on-site organic farm, and live/work space for more than 350 artists.



1906 Riot Tour Travel back in time to September 22, 1906, with this walking tour of downtown Atlanta on the day a race riot broke out, a violent incident that lasted for days and had to be stopped by state militia. Historians say as many as 40 African Americans were killed, but the incident was suppressed by local media and was neither taught nor commemorated until recently.

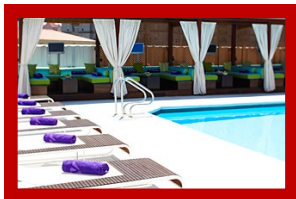

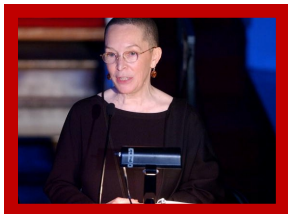
